Minutes Public Hearing 115 N. Thomson, Iowa, LA 70647 May 12, 2025

Mayor Douglas Watkins called a public hearing to order at 7:00 p.m. There was present, Mayor Watkins; Council Members Joe Becnel, Julie Fontenot, Gerald Guidry, and Vernessa Guillory; Town Attorney Eugene Bouquet; Town Clerk Cynthia Mallett; Chief of Police Keith Vincent; About 14 Citizens.

Mayor Watkins read the introduced Ordinance No. 2025-01, An Ordinance to amend Article V, Section 2-122 of the Code of Ordinances of the Town of Iowa, Louisiana, To Authorize the use of the Louisiana Department of Revenue Office of Debt Recovery for the Collection of Delinquent Debt, as Authorized by Louisiana Revised statutes 47:299.1 ET SEQ., and to provide for Related Matters. He asked if there were any questions or comments. There were no questions or comments. He asked Town Clerk Cynthia Mallett to give a brief overview of the ordinance. Cynthia Mallett explained, the purpose of amending the ordinance is to change the collection agency used to collect the debts owed to the Town of Iowa, from Louisiana Municipal Advisory and Technical Services Bureau Corporation Offset Claims Program to Louisiana Department of revenue Office of Debt Recovery. Council Member Julie Fontenot asked if there would be the same cost fees as LAMATS. Cynthia Mallett said yes, they will take a percentage for their fees. There were no further questions or comments. Public Hearing was closed at 7:02 pm.

Regular Meeting 115 N. Thomson, Iowa, LA 70647 May 12, 2025

Mayor Watkins and Town Council met in Regular session this date in compliance with all requirements as to notice. Mayor Watkins called the meeting to order at 7:02pm.

Invocation was said by Council Member Joe Becnel followed by the pledge.

Mayor Watkins called roll. Present: Mayor Douglas Watkins; Council Members: Joe Becnel, Gerald Guidry, Julie Fontenot, and Vernessa Guillory; Absent was Council Member Daniel Hennigan. A quorum was established.

Others present were Town Clerk Cynthia Mallett; Town Attorney Eugene Bouquet; Chief of Police Keith Vincent and about 14 people.

It was moved by Julie Fontenot, seconded by Vernessa Guillory to amend the agenda to add, Motion to discuss the summer feeding program. The motion passed unanimously.

It was moved by Julie Fontenot, seconded by Joe Becnel to approve minutes as presented for regular meeting April 14, 2025. The motion passed unanimously.

Mayor Watkins announced that we will have the discussion of the feeding program first before the new business agenda items.

Council Member Julie Fontenot said there were some people present with the summer feeding program. She said that the contract had not been signed as of last Friday. She said that it was

discussed a few months ago and the Council voted to sign the contract. She asked if the contract had been signed.

Mayor Watkins recognized three of the representatives with Calcasieu Parish Human Services and said that we spoke to these people about a month ago and discussed the program in totality. He recognized a special guest with Domingue and Szabo Engineering firm.

He announced that there was \$3,000.00 set aside in the budget for the summer feeding program. He said last year we amended the proposed budget and gave \$6500,00 in the budget and that is when it was discussed. Council Member Vernessa Guillory asked why we aren't budgeting \$6500.00? Mayor Watkins said \$3,000.00 is what we have in revenue dollars we can spend. Council Member Julie Fontenot asked which location are they going to cut out? There was discussion about the two locations and where the lunches would best be served from. Council Member Julie Fontenot said she was in favor of doing both locations again and adjust the budget again. Mayor Watkins announced that this program is a USDA federally sponsored program. He gave the dollars that it cost to operate the program and the municipality contributions. There were discussions about the amount of money to contribute to the program. Ms. Erika Garrison with Calcasieu Parish Human Services came forward. She said the contract needs to be signed soon because the program begins June 2nd. She presented information about the program. She clarified how the grant works and the grant match that is needed from other agencies. Mr. Erik Johnson came forward and talked about other municipalities cutting their contribution to the program. He talked about the number of meals served last year and said there was no reason that we should cut the budget for this program. Mayor Watkins announced that there was a 32.6% drop in number of meals served from the prior year.

It was moved by Julie Fontenot, seconded by Joe Becnel to adopt amended agenda. The motion passed unanimously.

Mayor Watkins read Item one on the agenda and read the title of the proposed ordinance. It was moved by Julie Fontenot, seconded by Vernessa Guillory to approve Ordinance No. 2025-01. The motion passed unanimously.

ORDINANCE 2025 - 01

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ARTICLE V, SECTION 2-122 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE TOWN OF IOWA, LOUISIANA, TO AUTHORIZE THE USE OF THE LOUISIANA DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE OFFICE OF DEBT RECOVERY FOR THE COLLECTION OF DELINQUENT DEBT, AS AUTHORIZED BY LOUISIANA REVISED STATUTES 47:299.1 ET SEQ., AND TO PROVIDE FOR RELATED MATTERS.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and the Iowa Town Council of the Town of Iowa, Louisiana, that:

Section 1. Amendment

Article V, Section 2-122 of the Code of Ordinances of the Town of Iowa is hereby amended as follows:

Section 2-122. - Collection of Delinquent Debts.

Any charges levied herein which remain unpaid for 90 days past the due date shall be subject to collection through the Louisiana Department of Revenue, Office of Debt Recovery, utilizing the state tax refund offset and other available collection programs. Overdue charges will be offset from the individual income tax refund of the consumer. Should payment be collected through the Louisiana Department of Revenue's Office of Debt Recovery, a collection fee of twenty-five percent (25%) of the total debt will be added to the amount owed by the consumer, in addition to all other charges, interest, and penalties collected. Pursuant to L.R.S. 33:361, the agreement with the Louisiana Department of Revenue, Office of Debt Recovery for participation in the state tax refund offset and debt recovery program in the form attached hereto is approved, and the Mayor is authorized to execute it.

Section 2. Effective Date This ordinance shall become effective upon adoption and publication as required by law.
